

An Awesome Equestrian Trip – How the West Was Run

Our new 2011 Equus was put to the test travelling close to 8,000 km from Vancouver down the west coast of Washington, Oregon, California, to Newport Beach (Balboa Island for a swim in the Pacific Ocean), then east to Palm Desert, up to Las Vegas, Hoover Dam, Sedona (AZ), Grand Canyon, Zion and Bryce Canyon, out the back way via the infamous ‘Hogs Back Road’ to Torrey (UT), on to Salt Lake City, and home through the Columbia Gorge, Portland, and Seattle. To show our German visitors the beauty of the SW USA, we deliberately drove scenic and challenging roads: Big Sur, Mulholland Drive (Beverly Hills), Hwy 74 Palm Desert, Jerome (AZ), Grand Canyon north side through Zion – then, Bryce Canyon through Escalante-Torrey Hwy 12 (UT).

The Equus was equally at home on tight twisting roads (keeping rear-seat passengers comfortable) and high-speed touring with serene quietness (even at 80 mph – legal in Utah) to enjoy the wonderful Lexicon sound system. Loaded and weighed down absolutely to the max, fuel consumption was expectedly good –managing 9.0 l/100km with normal freeway driving at about 120km/hr (with regular grade) – ‘expectedly good’ because I achieved those figures with my previous Lexus LS430 (using premium grade).
